

## Tour of the Czech Scrolls Memorial Trust and the Krakow Exhibition led by Evelyn Friedlander

Wednesday 10 March 2010, 10:45am for 11:00am

The Story of the rescue of 1,564 Czech Scrolls by Westminster Synagogue, which arrived at Kent House in February 1964, has passed into history as a small but remarkable episode in the tragedy of European Jewry. As an intimate link with individual congregations that were destroyed by the Nazis, the Scrolls were a symbol of sorrow as well as hope. Over the four-and-a-half decades since their arrival, the racks have grown emptier as one Scroll after another has been restored to its rightful place in Jewish life around the world.
